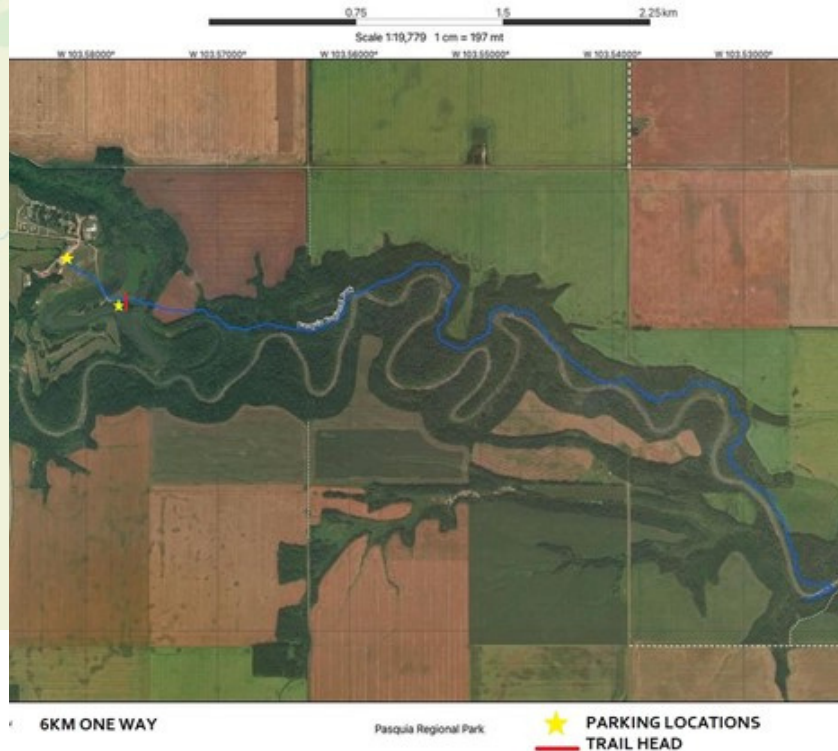
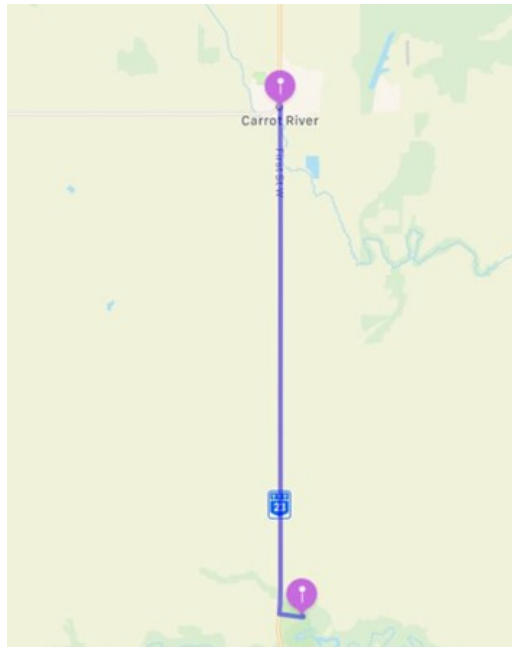




You will find the Andy Jamault trailhead at Pasquia Regional Park, located 10km south of Carrot River on Highway 23. The above map shows the park location.

There is parking in the park, located on the top of the hill during all seasons and closer to the trailhead during summer and fall. Park entrance fees apply May through to September.

SELF GUIDED TOUR

Andy Jamault Trail

(Mult-Use Trail)



This is a multi-use trail, please be aware of others.

Remember to respect the space. Leave behind all fossils and your footprints. Take only photos, memories, and of course, your trash.

A trail map can be found on the All Trails and Trail Clectiv apps.

Cellular service is spotty and unreliable.

Take a walk back in time, through the forest and along the river banks to a spot where prehistoric crocodiles swam over Saskatchewan's OUTBACK. During the summer months, this is a lush hike among towering trees and abundant ferns. This is 6km one way with mild elevation gains. You will find a wonderful lookout spot at about 2.5km in, taking a lunch is recommended. Plan to take 3 - 4 hours to fully enjoy the experience. Once at the Carrot River take note of the surroundings, especially the walls of shale. Look for a pale yellow line on the wall; this indicates the "line of extinction". The line indicates the time during dinosaurs and the time after.

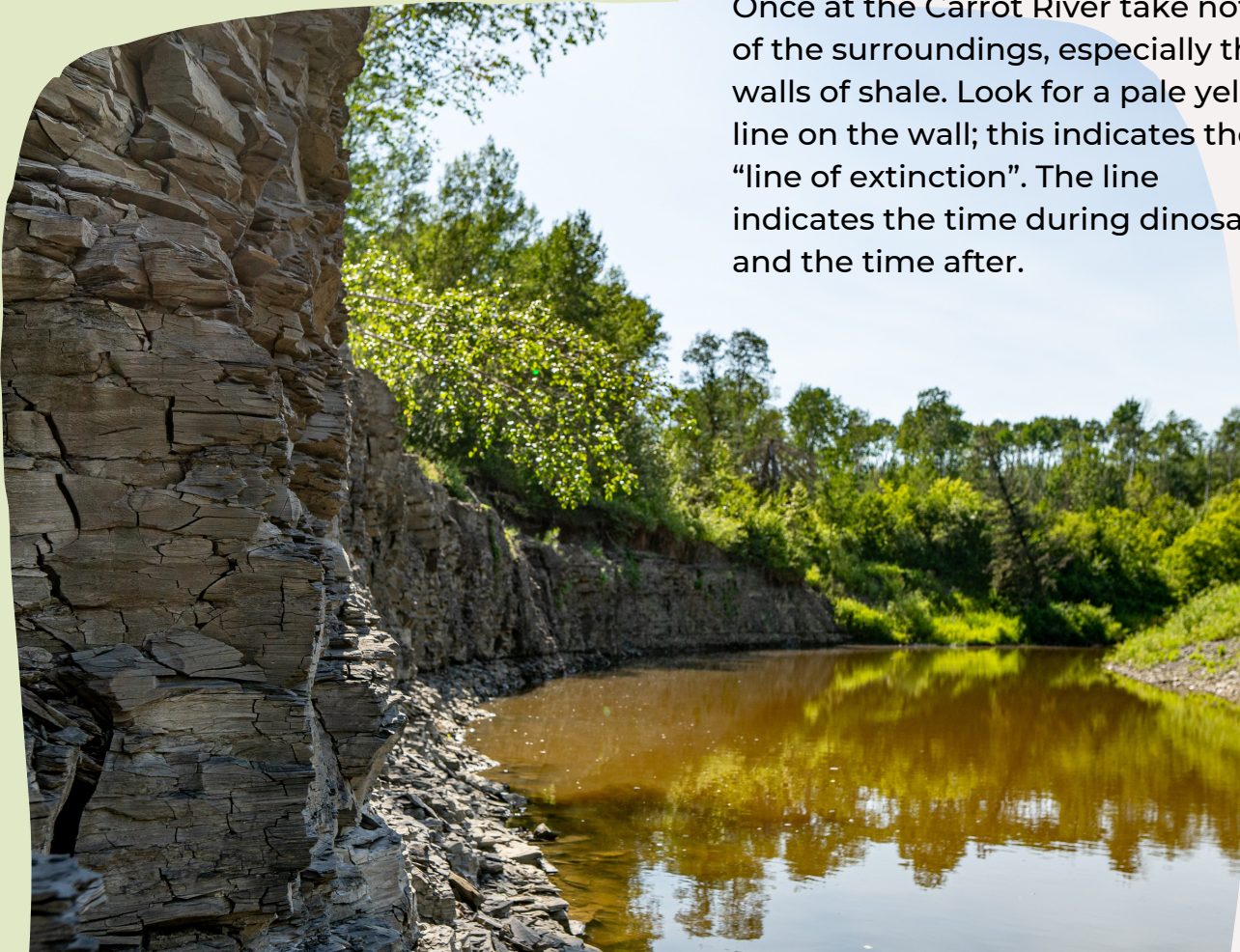


Enjoy your time and remember to contact the Royal Museum if you find any fossils and take only photos.
